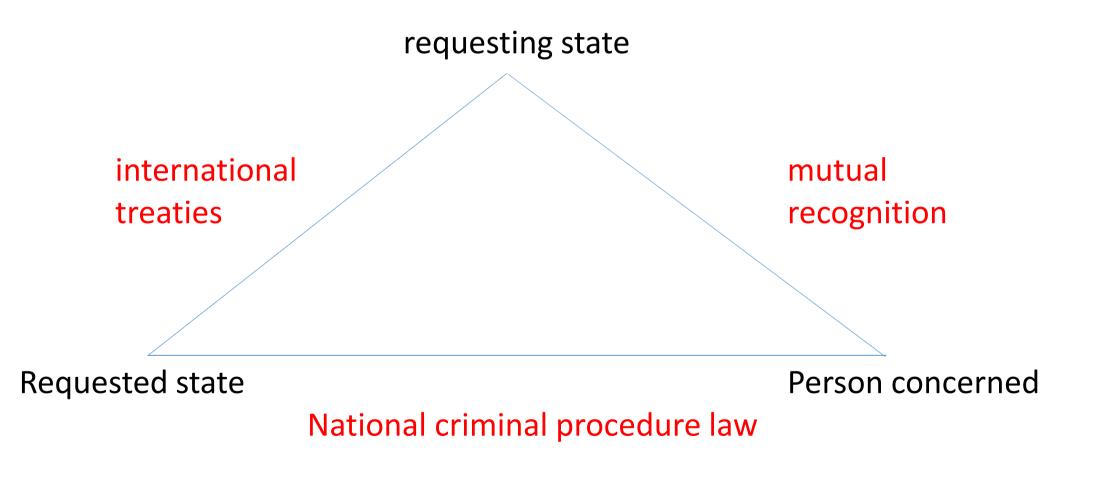

Procedural Challenges

- Long channel of communication use of electronic
- Missing interest in the execution of foreign requests building networks
- Specialized units
 - national level
 - international level (Interpol, Europol, Eurojust)
 - European Public Prosecutor?

- Negative conflicts
- Positive conflicts
- Coordination
- The role of Eurojust

General Substantive Challenges

- Fair trial, Art. 6 ECHR
- No torture, Art. 3 ECHR
- Unbearably hard sentences
- National data protection rules
- No extradition of own nationals

Special Investigative Techniques

Joint Investigation Teams

- Setting up by an agreement
- Close coordination
- Hierarchic structure
- Acting on foreign territory
- Respect for foreign rules on gathering evidence

Asset Forfeiture

- Crime must not pay!
- Asset tracing
- Asset freezing
- Asset forfeiture
 - Traditional rules
 - Non conviction based asset forfeiture
 - Civil forfeiture
- Asset sharing
